DEPARTMENT 12-OPEN CLASS GRAINS AND HAY-SECTION C-HAY AND STRAW

- Long hay and straw only.-ONE ENTRY PER CLASS
- An exhibit tied with twine must consist of a bale section approximately 8” thick.

CLASS 1st/\$4, 2nd/\$3.50, 3rd/\$3, 4th/\$2.50, 5th/\$2

HAY

1. Alfalfa or alfalfa grass mixed. First cutting. Not over 50% grasses
2. Alfalfa or alfalfa grass mixed. Later cuttings. Not over 50% grasses

3. Other legumes or legume grass mixtures. Not over 50% grasses
4. Grass – First cutting. Mixtures of timothy and/or other grasses and containing not more than 10% legumes.
5. Grass – Second cutting. Mixtures of timothy and/or other grasses and containing not more than 10% legumes.
6. Summer, annual grasses. Sudan grass, Sorghum, Sudan hybrids, etc.

STRAW

DEPARTMENT 12-OPEN CLASS GRAINS AND HAY-SECTION D-SILAGE

- Silage to be exhibited in 1-gallon self-closing bag.
- One entry per class
- Current year only, may be frozen.

CLASS 1st/\$4, 2nd/\$3.50 , 3rd/\$3, 4th/\$2.50, 5th/\$2

1. Alfalfa or alfalfa grass mixed. First cutting not over 50% grasses
2. Alfalfa or alfalfa grass mixed. Later cuttings. Not over 50% grasses
3. Other legumes or legume grass mixtures. Not over 50% grasses
4. Grass. First cutting. Mixtures of timothy and/or other grasses containing not over 10% legumes
5. Grass. Second cutting. Mixtures of timothy and/or other grasses and containing not more than 10% legumes
6. Summer, annual grasses, Sorghum, Sudan hybrids, etc.
7. Small grain silage w/without preservative
8. Corn Silage

DEPARTMENT 13-OPEN CLASS VEGETABLES AND HERBS-SECTION A -VEGETABLES

- In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest; select marketable size specimens. If possible, do not mix varieties.
- The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge:
 - o Trueness to variety type. If at all, pick the specimens from one variety.
 - o Uniformity in shape, size, and color
 - o Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, select others as similar as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity and leave stems on where possible.
 - o Protect from dirt, disease, infection, and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
 - o Condition and maturity. Be sure that the exhibits are of high quality.
- Read premium material carefully, following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for 5 specimens, be sure to exhibit that number; do not enter 4 or 6. In any instance, your exhibits will be disqualified if the correct number of specimens is not entered.
- Each exhibitor is responsible for entering his vegetables in the proper class. Flat yellow onions entered in the globe yellow onion class will be disqualified.
- Exhibit your vegetables on white Styrofoam or heavy paper plates except where specifically told otherwise.
- Products must be made or produced by the exhibitor except in commercial designated classes.
