HEALTH RULES FOR LLAMAS/ALPACAS

1. A valid Veterinary-client-patient relationship (VCPR) form, signed by all parties, and issued within **90 days** of fair check-in are required. Completion of the VCPR form requires a visual, in-person examination by the signing veterinarian. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) are not required for entry but may be used in place of a VCPR form. CVIs must be completed and dated within **30 days** of entry. **Copies of the VCPR form or CVI MUST be collected at the time of check-in and entry into the Westmoreland Fair.**
2. Individual official identification (ID) is required and may include any of the following:
 - a. A USDA issued National Uniform Ear Tagging System (NUES) tag
 - b. A 15-digit animal identification number ear tag starting with "840"
 - c. An ISO-compliant 15-digit microchip
3. For animals without any of the ID options listed in number 2 above, the animal's name and a description should be included on the VCPR form or CVI. Description should include the animal's color, sex, breed, and any distinguishing markings. A photo may accompany the CVI or VCPR form but is not required.
4. Recommendations: It is recommended, but not required, that all llamas and alpacas entering the fair are vaccinated for RABIES and Clostridium difficile and Tetanus (CD&T) prior to entry.

Out of State Camelids: Animals originating from out of state must comply with the Westmoreland Fair Health Rules and the requirements set forth by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture at <https://www.agriculture.pa.gov/Animals/AHDServices/Documents/2018%20Animal%20Health%20Rules%20for%20PA%20Fairs.pdf>

1. Young llamas and alpacas must be weaned.
 2. Classes with exhibitor's age classifications are ages as of January 1 of the current year.
 3. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping animal and assigned areas clean and well taken care of.
 4. **All livestock exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding.**

Additional guidelines for 4-H and FFA entries:

1. Entry fee is to be paid for each Division (Open Class and/or 4-H/FFA) entered.
2. Members must have project animal identified by June 1 of this current year with the extension office. Members may identify two animals for project work.
3. One of the identified project animals is to be used for their respective showmanship class.
4. 4-H exhibitors must have a completed up-to-date project book for the animal to be shown. Books must be checked before animal can be shown.
5. If there is a valid reason that the exhibitor cannot show his/her animal then another member who meets the requirements may show animal, however, not in showmanship. Exhibitors not showing their own animal must notify the show superintendent before entering the ring.
