### DEPARTMENT 5 -OPEN CLASS SWINE DEPARTMENT 107 -4-H AND FFA SWINE – BREEDING DEPARTMENT 108-4-H AND FFA SWINE-MARKET

**ENTRY FEE - \$4.00 per animal**

**Entries not limited to Westmoreland County**

**Breeding Swine Show Sunday August 18, 3 PM, or immediately following the Dairy Goat Show- Small Arena**

#### **HEALTH RULES FOR SWINE**

1. All swine must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the **30 days** prior to the date of check-in to the Westmoreland Fairgrounds. Veterinary-patient-client relationship (VCPR) forms are required **IN-ADDITION** to the required CVI. **Copies of the VCPR form AND CVI must be collected at the time of check-in and entry into the Westmoreland Fair.**
2. All swine must be permanently identified by an official 840 series RFID ear tag and the ear tag numbers must be recorded on the CVI.
3. All swine must be visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee. All swine must be free of infectious and contagious disease and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on most CVI forms). All animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds. **Animals are not to be unloaded until animals and health requirements are checked.**
4. All breeding swine exhibitions must occur prior to the arrival of any market swine. All the following conditions apply:
  - a. Castrated swine shall not be classified as breeding swine.
  - b. Breeding swine shall be removed from the animal exhibition premises prior to any market swine arrival.
  - c. Breeding swine for exhibitions shall arrive, exhibit, and depart in a period no greater than 72hrs.
5. All market swine are terminal once they arrive at the fairgrounds. All market swine will move directly to a USDA licensed slaughter facility the day following the livestock sale and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized slaughter establishment.

**Out of State Swine:** Animals originating from out of state must comply with the Westmoreland Fair Health Rules and the requirements set forth by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture at

1. No swine showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease will be admitted to any show.
  2. All show swine must be individually identified.
  3. All swine must have registration papers to show as purebreds.
  4. Original Animal Breed Registration papers will be checked prior to the show.
  5. Joint ownership considered being as one owner in accordance with registration papers. No exhibitor may enter more than 2 animals in any one class, limited to one entry per group class per exhibitor.
  6. All swine must have a nipple waterer.
  7. All livestock exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding.
  8. No miniature breeds will be accepted for entry.
  9. All "Other Purebred" classes must be registered in the *Recognized Swine Associations for Pork Producing*.
  10. All animals must come into the show ring for their respective class, only then can they be considered in group classes.

**The following are additional guidelines for 4-H/FFA entries:**



1. **Refer to General Rules for Swine as well as the additional 4H & FFA guidelines.**
2. All show swine must be individually identified.
3. No exhibitor may show more than two market swine.
4. Weight requirement: 230-290 lbs.
5. Open to purebred and crossbred barrows and gilts.
6. Gilts shown in breeding classes cannot be shown in market classes.
7. Nipple waterer required.
8. Due to weight variances and weight limits, the fair will set the number of weight classes.

**DEPARTMENT 108-SECTION B- 4-H & FFA SWINE SHOWMANSHIP**

1. 4-H and FA members **must** show an animal in the showmanship contest provided it has been carried as a project and is owned by the exhibitor.
2. Up to 6 (six) classes will be created, determined by the entries received.

**DEPARTMENT 108, SECTION E, 4-H & FFA ULTRASOUND CARCASS SWINE**

**ENTRY FEE - \$4.00 per animal**

1. Open to purebred and crossbred barrows and gilts that are entered as a market animal and meet the weight requirements of the market classes. Weight requirement on swine is 230-290 pounds.
2. Animals must be entered in both the Market Class as well as the Carcass Contest. All Market animals may be designated to compete in an Ultrasound carcass contest. The animal must be designated at the time of weigh in.
3. Animals entered in the Ultrasound classes must be entered and shown in the Market Classes.
4. Hogs must meet the minimum back fat standards of the contest, or they will be disqualified.
5. Results to be announced at the close of the Market Show Champion Drive.
6. Carcass results will have no effect on placing in the Market show.
